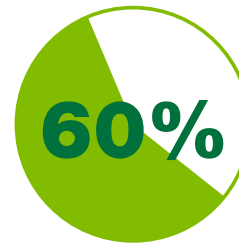

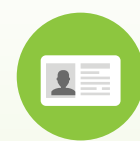

\$250 incentive

OR

\$400 incentive

when you install an ENERGY STAR qualified CAC system. (ENERGY STAR qualified criteria = minimum 14.5 SEER and 12 EER).

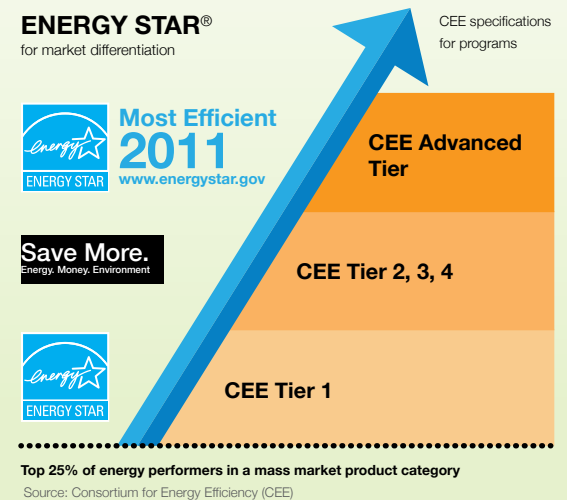
when you install a stand-alone CEE "Tier 2" level central air conditioning system. ("Tier 2" level qualified criteria = minimum 15 SEER and 12.5 EER).

\$250 incentive

when you install a high-efficiency furnace equipped with an Electronically Commutated Motor (ECM).

WHY USE A PARTICIPATING CONTRACTOR?

Minimum of \$2 million in liability insurance coverage

Letter of clearance from Workplace Safety and Insurance Board

Signed Contractor Participation Agreement



For ENERGY STAR[®] qualified CAC systems:

- 313A Refrigeration and Air Conditioning licence or
- a 313D Residential Air Conditioning Licence



For ECM-equipped furnace installations:

- TSSA Registration number to confirm licensed technicians
- (Gas Technician 1 or 2 or OBT 1 or 2 certification number).
